

This book is an extension of the rhyme "Hickory Dickory Dock" with a verse for each number, and even the first verse is changed from the original. A sample: "Hickory dickory dock, a bird sang to the clock. The clock struck two...away she flew! Hickory dickory dock. "Each verse is essentially the same. In every illustration, the clock stands in the same spot, maybe with something new on its ledge, and with different animals and occurrences in the background. But, the clock is in the exact same spot, which makes the illustrations seem very static and flat despite everything else changing. It could be argued that the story and illustrations will help a child learn to read the time by the hands of a clock, but by the time, they can pick up such things, this book would probably be below their interests. The book was just too repetitive on the whole for my tastes. I didn't enjoy reading it. And,
